School History

Princeton High School International was created as a Christian Educational Academy & Outreach Ministry of New Millennium, Inc. a 501c3 non-for-profit faith-based organization, Jehovah Jireh Ministries and Jehovah Jireh Bible Institute of Higher Learning in December 2017. Princeton High School International is a 501c3 non-for-profit school designed to educate the underprivileged, disenfranchised, high school dropouts, socially disadvantaged, at-risk students, gifted students and adults who need an opportunity to complete their high school education. Princeton High School offers one of the most progressive, accessible and transformational 21st Century Educational opportunity for any person or individual that desires to obtain a quality and career ready high school education. Princeton High School International main campus is located in Alexander City, AL the former home of Harvard High School International Learning Center Alabama/Kentucky from 2012 to Present. Many of our students have been accepted into the military, accepted in many two-year and four-year colleges, gained better employment and advanced in their careers by completing their high school education.

Princeton High School International was designed initially to give Jehovah Jireh Bible Institute of Higher Learning postsecondary certificate, undergraduate, and seminary students the opportunity to earn a high school diploma to qualify to enroll into JJBIHL undergraduate religious degree programs of study. Princeton High School Int'l encourages all of its students to take the ACT or SAT for college preparation and career recognition to enter into certain vocations immediately after earning their high school diploma.

Princeton High School International enrollment age is from 13 through 19 and older. Princeton High School International enroll students from grades 9 through12 and adults of all ages. Princeton High School accepts students from all walks of life, gifted, disabled and special needs. Princeton High School offers an alternative high school diploma program for students encountering truancy, social problems, academic issues, scheduling conflicts, retention placement, behavior problems, bullying, suspension, expulsion and having the opportunity to fast track and accelerate their education. In August of 2023, Princeton High School International became a K- 12 Grade Private School Institution. Princeton High School administers standardized tests for all K – 8 grade students.

Princeton High School International Educators - possess state teacher certification license and certificates in the area of grades K-12. PHSI Educators credentials consist of Master through Doctoral Degrees in Education and Religion. Our Educators also possess national private school certification in all areas of teaching K-12, Private School Administration, School Counseling and Public School Administration.

(9-12 Academic Program)

Princeton High School International academic year consist of two semesters. Princeton Students' courses and study modules are self-paced or accelerated during the school year. Traditionally semester 1 and 2 are divided into two nine-week terms to complete courses and earn credits. Princeton High School Int'l offers students a non-traditional educational model which allow students to enroll and take classes year-round to earn their high school diploma.



Princeton High School International students in grade nine will earn (7) credits, students in grade ten will earn (7) credits, students in grade eleven will earn (7) credits and students in grade twelve will earn (7) credits. Princeton High School International students will have to complete 28 credits (Equivalent to four years of study) for graduation. Princeton High School International students will take 24 core courses/modules and 8 elective courses (Equivalent to 4 Units) totaling 28 credits to earn their high school diploma.

(Grades 9-12 Transfer Students & Adult Learners) P. 1



Students that transfer credits to Princeton High School International from other public and private accredited secondary schools with a passing grade of C or higher will be evaluated for our reciprocity and articulation of credits program. (Princeton's reciprocity and articulation of credits policy) put students on a fast-track for graduation. Adult learners that transfer in a G.E.D. will be evaluated accordingly, to determine what courses students need to complete, to earn their high school diploma.

Princeton High School Int'l academic instruction allows students to earn their high school diploma through PHSI Distance Learning, Online Learning and Learning Centers Seminar Track Studies Model. PHSI students can complete courses at anytime and anywhere around the world through our E-Learning Educational Instructional Platform. Through this educational instructional platform students can take module courses online or given access to download and complete courses in the comfort of their home.

Princeton High School International utilizes the (ACE) pre and post assessment program to assist PHSI with K- 12 students and adult learners' grade and curriculum placement. The assessments give PHSI staff the knowledge to help all students reach their greatest potential academically, while progressing through early childhood/elementary grades successfully and earn their high school diploma. PHSI offers preparatory college coursework through JJBIHL such as (College Math, College Physical Science, Psychology, English Composition, Humanities and any seminary courses in the field of Religion and Theology).

(Grades 9-12 Transfer Students & Adult Learners) P. 2

PHSI offers college coursework to students through COURSERA for advance studies and college credit. COURSERA is one of the top Alternative Academic College Programs in the World, recognized by CHEA USA. Students enrolled in PHSI will have the opportunity to take courses from top accredited Universities in the USA and around the World (such as Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Duke, Tel Alviv University in Israel). Students enrolled in PHSI will have the opportunity to take any course at any time in almost any subject or field of study. When students graduate from PHSI, they will be able to use this online academic resource (COURSERA) the rest of their lives through lifelong learning for educational training and advancement in college or in their careers.

PHSI students' prerequisite for graduation consist of an exit/competency exam for graduation after all necessary coursework has been completed in their program of study. PHSI students and adults who enroll with disabilities or have a special needs background will be given social and academic support services to ensure (fair educational practice and educational equality for all students) them success in obtaining their high school diploma.

PHSI students that register for our College & Career Preparatory Program, will participate in a dual enrollment academic program of study. PHSI students that complete all necessary high school credits and college courses will graduate from PHSI with a (CCPP) high school diploma. PHSI students in the (CCPP) College & Career Preparatory Program high school transcript will demonstrate 28 high school credits and 5 to 6 college credits (15 to 18 credit hrs./ 1-1/2 college semester academic year of work) completed with a passing grade of C or higher from Princeton High School International.

Therefore, the PHSI students that complete the (CCPP) College & Career Preparatory Program can graduate with 5 to 6 extra courses on their academic transcript totaling up to 34 high school credits. PHSI students must understand that although they may graduate with college credit from our (CCPP) College & Career Ready Preparatory Program, it doesn't necessary guarantee every college or postsecondary school will give you credit for college courses.

Accepting PHSI (CCPP) Program and any other public or private school dual enrollment program, is solely up to each individual college or university. Students enrolled in our (CCPP) Program will be required to register and take the ACT or SAT and participate in U.S. States Military ASVAB (CEP Program) Career Exploration Program. This program is a Career Ready Preparation Program for any career and students do not have to go into Military that completes this Program.


{AVASB (CEP) CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM}

Princeton High School International participates in the ASVAB (CEP) Career Exploration Program with the U.S. Military. The ASVAB (CEP) Program empower students nationwide to discover their strengths, interest and map out their postsecondary and career field choice plans that will work for them.

The ASVAB (CEP) Program is for Princeton High School International 10th through 12th grade students and students 18 through 23 years of age. Any of our Adult Learners between the ages of 24 - 30 that have a great interest in getting into college or entering a better career field will be allowed to participate in the (CEP) program and must understand If they choose to go into the military, they will be referred to a military recruiter. PHSI students that are 23 years of age and below, interested in entering into the military, will be able to get assistance through the (CEP) coordinator that is assigned to PHSI.

The ASVAB (CEP) Program is a career ready preparation program that will provide PHSI students with alternative resources, academic resources, and career choice resources for all students to succeed after you obtain your high school diploma. Students that do not enroll in PHSI dual enrollment programs are still encouraged to participate in (CEP) program for career preparation after you graduate from Princeton High School International.

Remember the ASVAB (CEP) Program is not to recruit you into the military. It is a college and career ready preparation program. The ASVAB (CEP) can prepare any individual to be able to compete in any career field in a global world.

- * All students need to print pdf doc, complete transcript request form and send it to your former high school, homeschool, or GED Center requesting for your official transcripts to be sent to Princeton High School International admissions office mailing address below.
- * All students must print pdf doc, Princeton High School International enrollment agreement form about tuition policy, registration policy, and program completion policy. (Scan, Fax, Email or Mail to Admissions Office Address Below)
- * PHSI registration and orientation non-refundable processing fee is \$75.00.
- * PHSI application and processing fee must be submitted with all completed documents for you to have an academic assessment evaluation. During this session PHSI Staff will
- * inform you about the academic requirements you need to meet, to complete your course of study to earn your high school diploma. The registration and orientation session will give each student an opportunity to see which PHSI high school diploma program is best for them.
- * Once student has been accepted into Princeton High School International, he or she must pay their private school tuition in full in order to start their course of study to graduate from PHSI. Students that are not able to pay in full, can use our monthly payment plan to make **Tuition Payments** until paid in full. Once student meet all tuition debts with PHSI, then he or she can start their studies to earn their high school diploma.
